Starting Your Testimony

Frequently Asked Questions:

- What is a Testimony? Your testimony is a telling of your life story and your declaration that you want to be a part of God's Story and will seek to trust and follow Jesus all the days of your life by being a part of his body the church.
- Why do we write a testimony? We tell this story to the congregation as a way of declaring our trust in Jesus and our desire to partner with God's people in our congregation to continue to be a part of God's reconciling work in our world today.
- What do I need to help me write my testimony? First it is important to understand why we share our testimonies and what the purpose of a testimony is. You can read pages 120-130 in God's Story, Our Story, see the answers above or have further conversation with Pastor Andrea today. Second, you need time for reflection and prayer, which is why we are here today. Utilize your time to reflect on the events of your life and how you perceive God fitting into your life. Journal about the questions below these answers will make up your testimony.
- **How long should it be?** There is no specific expectation for length other than long enough for you to tell your faith story and declare your intentions to follow Jesus and join God's people (the church) in our mission in the world.
- What if I am uncomfortable speaking in front of the congregation? There are many ways to tell a story the traditional way has been to write out your story and present it to the congregation through speaking. While there is an expectation to write out your story/testimony, if you have a creative way that you would like to share it or would like to discuss some options please speak with Pastor Andrea today.
- What do I do after today? Take your answers to the questions below and begin putting them together today into an order that makes sense for you. Write down your complete testimony and turn in a draft by Sunday, June 7 email it to andrea@mainstaycomm.net. How Do I Start My Testimony?
